

# Ladies Club Competition Draw Guidelines (2018)

**The Ladies Captain and Ladies Secretary** will make the draws using the names from the competition entry forms.

**The date of the draws** will be displayed on the notice board so that any members may attend.

**The first names drawn will be for the preliminary round**, if appropriate. The player on the top of the selection (player 1) has to arrange the match by offering 3 dates to their opponent, to organise a marker if required and to put the date into the club diary. If they fail to do this a week before the play by date their opponent (player 2) will offer them 2 dates. The match must be played by the date specified on the competition sheet which will be displayed on the club notice board. If the match can't be played their opponent (player 2) goes through to the next round.

**The Mary Bailey.** The draw will be made using the original idea of Mary Bailey with one seasoned and one less experienced player in a pair. Each pair plays every other pair as in a round robin on one day. Each game will be 10 ends or 1 hour. 2 points for a win and 1 for a draw with shot difference in case of a tie.

**Choosing the Rink.** Player 1 can choose which rink to play on. If player 2 objects to the chosen rink she can insist on making a draw from the available rinks so that neither player has an advantage.

**The winner** of each round in a competition should inform the Ladies Secretary of the results as soon as possible after the match in order for the next round to be organised. The score card can be placed on the ladies notice board.
